You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government election on 26 March 2026 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Cranbrook.

**Residents**

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00pm Wednesday, 28 January 2026. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

**Enrolment Forms**

You can enrol or update your details online, or download an enrolment form, via the Western Australian Electoral Commission website [www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol](http://www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol). Forms are also available from the Australian Electoral Commission [www.aec.gov.au](http://www.aec.gov.au). Enrolments and updates must be completed and received by 5:00pm Wednesday, 28 January 2026.

**Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers**

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Cranbrook and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Cranbrook to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol and have paid rent for at least the prescribed amount.

**Joint Owners and Occupiers**

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

**Corporations**

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are officers of the body corporate that are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

**Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only**

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00pm Wednesday, 28 January 2026. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Cranbrook.

Did you know that the Shire of Cranbrook is a licensing agent for the Department of Transport, as such we are not permitted to take licensing enquiries over the phone.

If you are attending the administration office to complete licensing duties please ensure you come prepared. The best way to make sure you have everything you require for your enquiry is to jump onto the Department of Transport website before hand and familiarise yourself with what your particular enquiry may need.

If you come prepared with the correct ID requirements and information it will streamline the time you spend within the admin office. Please note that our staff have to follow the directions and regulations set upon us from the Department of Transport.

If you are unable to come into the Shire of Cranbrook Administration Office for your licensing enquiry you must contact the Department of Transport on 13 11 56.

### PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

**31/10/2025 TO 15/02/2026 (all dates inclusive)**

Only protective burning can be carried out during the Prohibited Burning time and under the following conditions:

1. No burning permitted on Christmas Day (25 December).
2. All burning must be carried out between the hours of 5.00pm and midnight of the same day.
3. All conditions of Restricted Burning Period must be complied with.
4. A permit to burn must be obtained.

You can exchange up to two of your old showerheads (per household) for new water-efficient WELS 4-star rated models for free! Simply bring your old showerhead(s) to the Shire's Admin Office with a copy of your recent water bill, or Waterwise letter from Water Corporation.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

Around 22% of total household water is used in the shower alone. The type of showerhead you use makes a big difference. By switching to a waterwise showerhead, you can be more sustainable and save up to 20,000 litres of water each year.



## HOW TO PREPARE FOR SNAKE SEASON

- Take care in bushland and grassy areas.
- Walk and/or cycle in cleared areas only, where you can see the ground.
- When bushwalking, wear long trousers and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably cover the ankles.
- Keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking, and avoid entering areas of long grass, rushes and undergrowth.
- Around your home remove long grass and items lying on the ground such as corrugated iron, which may provide cover for snakes.
- Reduce mice numbers around the house
- Make your house and property less attractive to snakes. Remove any debris or woodpiles, cut back long grass and shrubbery, remove leaf litter and block any holes around the outside of your house that may look like a safe spot to hide.






Louise is a qualified registered counsellor, who also farms with her husband in Kentdale. This means she fully understands cropping and livestock.

Throughout 2025, the Gillamii Centre delivered a range of on-ground and community-focused actions as part of the *Improving Feral Cat Management in the Kent–Frankland Subregion* project, supporting healthier landscapes, native wildlife protection and productive farming systems.

A key focus of the year was working directly with landholders and community groups to encourage coordinated feral cat management across the region. In 2025, Gillamii sponsored two community feral cat and fox shoots at Frankland River and Tunney, bringing landholders and community members together to take part in responsible, coordinated pest control.

These events highlighted the value of working together across property boundaries to manage feral animals more effectively.

Education and awareness were also a strong focus. Gillamii partnered with CLAWS officers to deliver school education sessions, helping students understand the impacts of feral cats on native wildlife and the importance of responsible cat ownership. The enthusiastic response from schools reflected strong community interest in protecting local biodiversity.

On-ground control efforts were supported through contracted feral cat shooting on participating properties, alongside the introduction of new monitoring technology. In 2025, Gillamii deployed AxisTech SMART Traps at multiple sites to better understand feral cat activity and improve the targeting of future control efforts. This combination of monitoring, local knowledge and on-ground action strengthens long-term management outcomes.

Looking ahead, Gillamii will continue supporting community-led pest management, with three community feral cat and fox shoots planned for 2026 in Tunney, Frankland River and Tenterden. By combining education, monitoring and coordinated control, Gillamii is helping build a stronger, more connected approach to feral cat management across the Kent–Frankland subregion.

### Tips to keep your family safe during summer

The warm weather is well and truly here, which means you're probably outside more often with your family and friends. Consumer Protection has some timely summer safety tips for you to enjoy fun in the sun, including advice for pool supervision, safer bouncing on the trampoline and care around button batteries. West Aussies deserve to have a safe, happy, and healthy summer with no trips to the Emergency Department.

Pools are popular in summer, but they continue to be a major safety risk. Sadly, swimming pool drownings remain one of the leading causes of accidental death and life-changing injury for Australian children under the age of five. Drowning is silent and can happen within 20 seconds in just a few centimetres of water.

The best protection is adult supervision, so put the phone away and keep an eye on your precious little ones around water. Pools toys are fun and can make life easier with babies and toddlers but they are not safety devices and should never replace adult supervision. When buying or using pool toys, check the age and weight restrictions to ensure the products are appropriate for use.

Portable pools, like the cute blow up one the kids got for Christmas, might be small and seem safe, but they pose significant drowning risks to children. It's always a good idea to empty them and store away when they're not use, and give your plants and lawn a big drink so the water is not wasted.

Pool fencing also plays an important role in keeping young children safe around pools. WA's building laws require private swimming pools, spas, or portable pools that contain more than 30 centimetres of water to have compliant safety barriers. Pool gates should remain closed at all times and never be propped open. It's important to check regularly that they self-close and latch properly.

Another popular summer pastime is jumping on the trampoline but unfortunately using it incorrectly has led to many kids ending up in hospital. Make sure only one child uses a trampoline at a time, put padding on the frame and remove any hazards located near the trampoline. No one wants a broken bone, cuts or sprains from being double bounced off the side.

With Chrissy already a distant memory, it's a good time to check any gifts that came with button batteries. Make sure the battery compartment is still secure and can't be opened by children. If swallowed or inserted, button batteries can cause severe injury or death in as little as two hours.
