Have You Heard About the Guard Dog or the Wise Owl?

Frankland River Primary

Embeds the Grow Your Mind Program

If you have heard FRPS children, staff and families talking about a *guard dog*, a *sifting sooty*, a *sensitive octopus*, an *elephant who tries to remember*, or a *wise owl*, you may have found yourself wondering what on earth they are referring to. These friendly creatures are part of our school's journey with the **Grow Your Mind** program — an engaging wellbeing initiative that is steadily becoming part of daily life at Frankland River Primary School.

We began implementing the program last year, and thanks to ongoing commitment from staff — as well as financial support from the Shire of Cranbrook — Grow Your Mind is now firmly embedded across our classrooms.

Why the Animals? Why the Brain?

Grow Your Mind uses playful and memorable animal characters to teach children about key brain functions. Concepts that can otherwise feel abstract or complex suddenly make sense:

- The **Guard Dog** represents the part of the brain that reacts to danger.
- The **Wise Owl** helps with good decision making.

The **Sifting Sooty**, **Elephant**, and **Sensitive Octopus** connect to memory, focus, feelings, and emotional responses.

By linking wellbeing habits to these parts of the brain, students become more curious, engaged, and willing to practise skills such as gratitude, exercise, conflict resolution, healthy friendships, and emotional regulation.

Beyond Academics: Supporting the Whole Child

At Frankland River Primary School, we know that education is more than academic success. Our goal is to develop resilient, reflective, well-rounded young people who can navigate the ups and downs of life. When children have the tools to regulate emotions, show perspective, solve problems, and build positive relationships, they thrive — socially, academically, and physically.

Grow Your Mind helps us nurture these skills in every child.

What Grow Your Mind Looks Like at School

Students take part in a **dedicated weekly health and**

wellbeing lesson, exploring brain science, emotional skills, kindness, resilience, gratitude, and more. But the program also comes to life in small but powerful ways throughout the day.

At any point, you might see students:

- practising mindful breathing
- creating a plan to be kind
- listening to a Grow Your Mind song
- reframing unhelpful thoughts
- using positive affirmations
- helping others or caring for their environment
- taking a movement break to support focus

These short, responsive wellbeing moments help students build strong mental fitness habits that last.

The Home Connection

Grow Your Mind is a whole-school approach — and that includes families. The wellbeing of our parents, carers, and staff matters too. When children see adults modelling positive mental health strategies, the impact is even greater.

Reclaiming the Meaning of “Mental Health”

Grow Your Mind is on a mission to shift the way we talk about mental health. Mental health isn't only about challenges or disorders — it is something we *all* have, just like physical health. It can be great, not-so-great, or somewhere in between.

The program uses storytelling, drama, movement, videos, songs, reflection, and podcasts to shine a positive light on mental fitness. It makes learning about wellbeing engaging, memorable, and fun.

Building Lifelong Skills

By the time students leave Frankland River Primary School, we want them to carry a “tool belt” of mental fitness strategies. This might be why you hear your child talking about their character strengths, spreading kindness, doing something joyful, moving their body, or helping others.

These small habits add up to something powerful: young people who understand themselves, care for their minds, and approach life with confidence and resilience.

FRANKLAND RURAL SNAPSHOT

We recently held our client breakfast meeting -big thanks to everyone who came along, enjoyed the feed, and picked up some great insights from our speakers.

We heard some excellent presentations, including a deep dive into nitrogen from Tim Tresize, and a handy summary of Field Applied Research (FAR) trials from Kate Tresize.

Svetlana Micic then introduced the Red-Legged Earth Mite (RLEM) hatching tool, with early predictions pointing to hatching in April. If you suspect RLEM resistance on your property, let us know—we may be able to collect samples for testing in 2026.

We also heard from David Clegg, who shared an update on resistance across key blackleg groups, while Rob Harrison explained the nitrogen benefits from harvestable annual legumes.

Vintage in Frankland River is now well underway, with most growers wrapping up their Chardonnay and Pinot harvest. Fruit quality is looking fantastic—bright aromatics and natural balance are already shining through in the winery. A stretch of mild days and cool nights has created near-perfect ripening conditions, setting things up nicely for the weeks ahead 🍷

Rates are **not based on how much you paid for your property**, but usually on its **valued amount determined by the State Valuer General**


Important Information Before You Pay Your Rates

Every Rates Notice comes with its own unique BPAY Reference Number – and it's essential you use the correct one when making a payment.

- ⚡ If you don't, your payment may not be applied to the correct property... what does that mean?
- ⚡ That means you could be charged interest on what appears to be an 'unpaid' Rates Notice – even if you've already paid!

✔ What to do:

- ✔ Check your Rates Notice
- ✔ Use the unique BPAY Reference provided
- ✔ Pay each Rates Notice separately via BPAY
- ✔ Avoid unnecessary fees or confusion

Stay on top of your payments – double-check before you pay! 

- 🕒 Paying your rates after the due date means interest will accrue daily on any overdue amount – so it pays to be prompt.

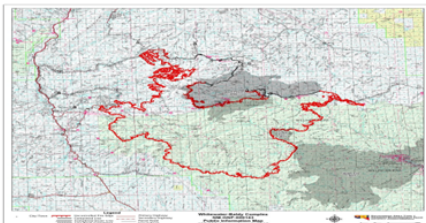

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD 15/02/2026 TO 30/04/2026 (all dates inclusive)

The law requires that a person shall not set fire to the bush during the Restricted Burning times unless he/she has:

1. Obtained a permit in writing from a Bush Fire Control Officer.
2. Notified all neighbours and a Bush Fire Control Officer.
3. Notified a Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions - Parks and Wildlife Service officer if the fire will be within 3km of a Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions—Parks and Wildlife Service Reserve.

The following conditions must be complied with when burning is carried out:

1. At least three able bodied persons must be in attendance .
2. At least one fire unit must be in attendance.
3. Any other conditions that are prescribed by the Fire Control Officer.

It remains the responsibility of the permit holder to ensure the validity of permit due to weather conditions prior to commencement of burning.

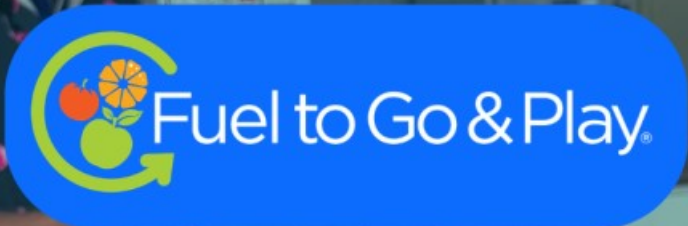

TOTAL FIRE BAN

GREEN FLAGS

BBQs
Using gas (enclosed flame) or electric BBQs (no flame) with a five metre clearing around the BBQ.

LAWN MOWERS
Electric and battery-operated lawn mowers can be used, but only if they don't create a spark. Avoid using them on dry grass.

POWER TOOLS
The use of power tools is allowed as long as it doesn't create a spark.

HARVESTING ACTIVITIES
Harvesting activities are allowed, if the local government has not implemented a Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban.

RED FLAGS

BBQs
BBQs, cookers or smokers that use solid or liquid fuel are not permitted in areas that are not fully enclosed.

LAWN MOWERS
Mowing with equipment powered by an internal combustion engine.

HOT WORKS
Hot works outdoors are not permitted (including angle grinding, welding, soldering and gas cutting).

CAMPFIRES
Campfires, bonfires and all open-air fires are illegal.

OFF-ROAD DRIVING
Petrol or diesel vehicles like 4WDs, quad bikes and motorcycles can't be driven over areas containing vegetation.

*If you are a business or public authority, you can carry out certain activities without an exemption if you meet the specific conditions outlined in the regulations
