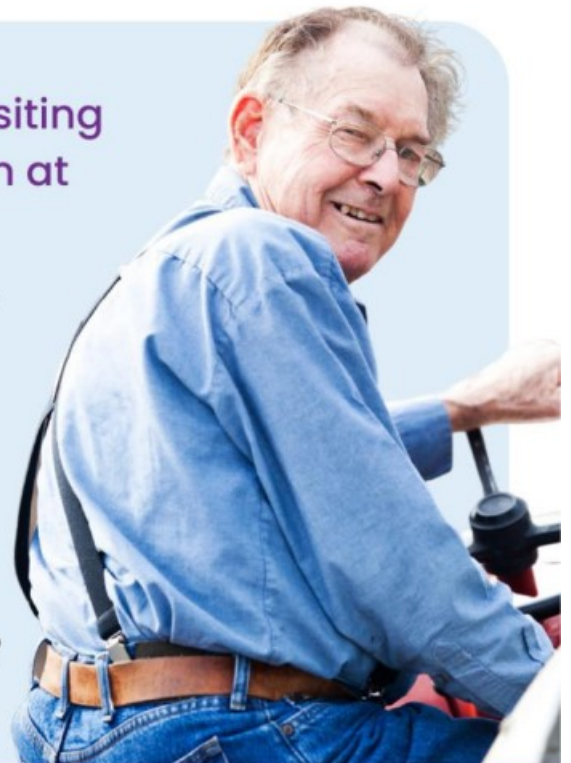

The community cropping group had another successful year for 2025. A total of 254 Tonnes of canola was delivered, our share being 185 T with an average yield of 2.5T per hectare. A great achievement given how wet the season turned out to be. Frankland Rural put on a fantastic lunch for everyone, while AFGRI and CLASS gave us a rundown of their demo harvesters. It's awesome to see such dedicated support from the machinery dealerships year on year.

A massive shout out to everyone involved on the day, whether you supplied machinery, fuel, grain carting, staff or simply showed up throughout the day for a look, its greatly appreciated.

AGM – General Election Results

Our Annual General Meeting was held on March 12th. We sincerely thank all members who attended. Overall, the election process was uneventful, with the majority retaining their positions. Special thanks to Stevie for her service as treasurer over the past two years; your efforts have been greatly valued. Bron Coole will now assume the role of treasurer. Our meeting was followed by dinner at the club to show our gratitude to those who contributed to the crop last year.

As many people know, the cropping group contributed funds to the country club to purchase the Trent Street property. We later donated an additional \$30,000 towards renovations. Last year, there were discussions about the importance of protecting this asset. As a

result, our group proposed to the club that we cover the cost of hiring a property manager. Both our group and the club now have a formal agreement in place to ensure asset protection, with Ray White Mount Barker now managing the property.

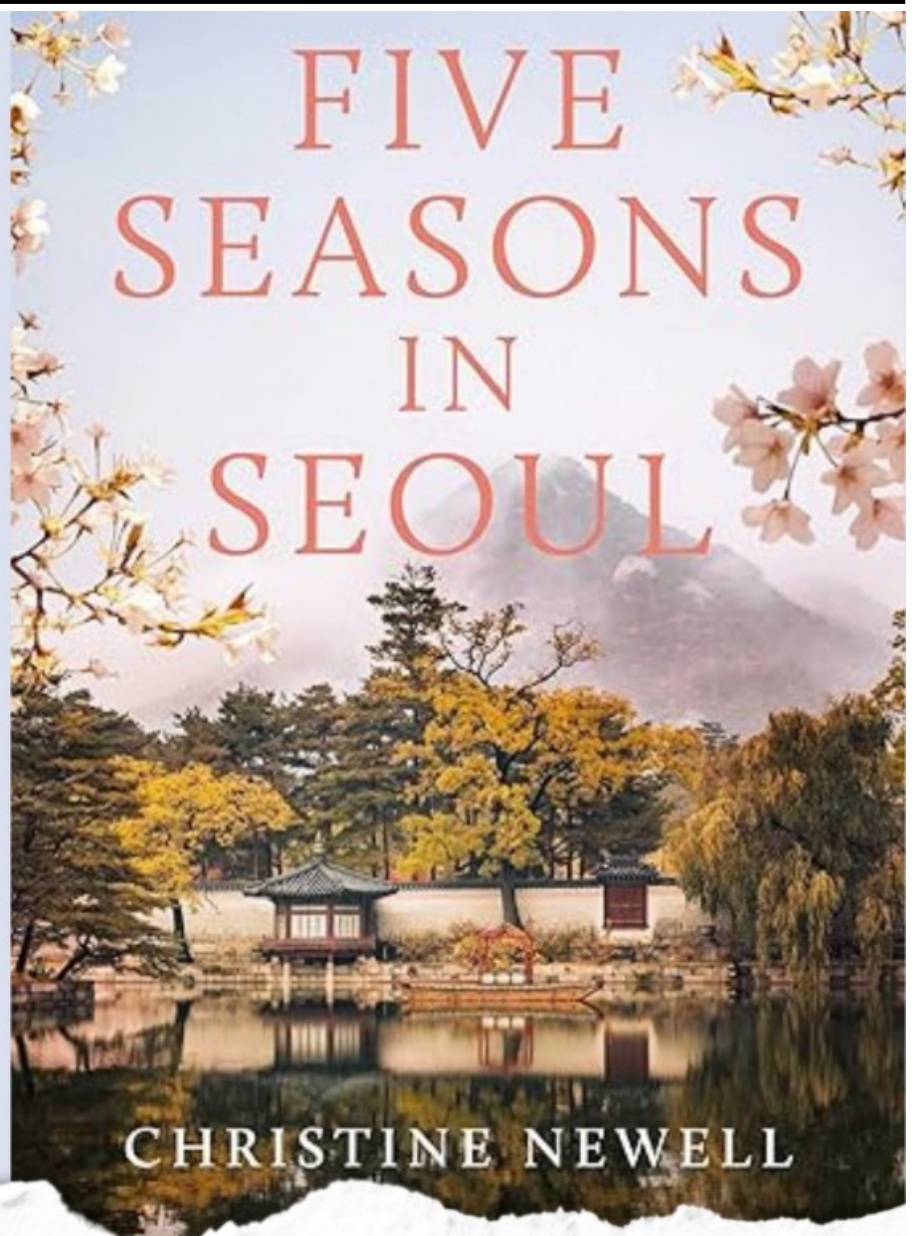

WA Seniors 2025-2026 Directory is out!

The new WA Seniors 2025-2026 Directory is now available, full of useful information to help seniors access the concessions and rebates available across WA.

If you're not already a member, it's a good time to join the WA Seniors Card program.

Membership is free and gives eligible Western Australians access to one of the most generous ranges of State Government concessions in Australia.

Benefits include:

- Cost of Living Rebate paid each July
- Up to 25-50% off local government rates and water charges (conditions apply)
- Safety and Security Rebate of up to \$400
- 50% off driver's licence and vehicle licence fees (higher rebates for Commonwealth Seniors Health Card holders)
- 50% off regional travel with Transwa
- Subsidy toward prescribed spectacles

These savings can make a real difference and help seniors stay independent, active and connected in the community.

Who is eligible?

You must:

- Be 65 years or older
- Be an Australian Citizen or hold a Permanent Resident Visa
- Live in Western Australia
- Be permanently retired or working no more than 25 hours per week in paid employment

If that sounds like you, it's worth applying and making sure you're not missing out.

FOREST PRODUCTS COMMISSION (FPC) ANNOUNCE THAT THEY WILL NO LONGER BE PAYING RATES TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.

The Shire of Cranbrook, in partnership with the local governments whom make up the Warren Blackwood Alliance, and the Shire of West Arthur, was keen to publicly acknowledge the short-term and long-term impact of Forest Products Commission's (FPC) non-payment of rates to local governments advised by them in September 2025.

The impact of the decision on local governments' current budgets was communicated to the Hon Jackie Jarvis MLC, Minister for Agriculture and Food; Fisheries; Forestry; Small Business; Mid West, by the group in a meeting held with her in January 2026. Cr Perin Mulcahy, our Shire President, and Ms Linda Gray, Chief Executive Officer, represented the Shire of Cranbrook at the meeting.

In the past, and prior to FPC's announcement, FPC has contributed to the rate base of each local government which has in turn paid for the maintenance and construction of roads and its general operating costs. However, in September 2025, FPC identified under the Forest Products Act 2000 Sec 43(2) that they are legally exempt from paying rates to local governments for unleased land and are required instead, under Sec 43(4) to pay a rates equivalent amount directly to the Treasurer each year. The Treasurer, under Sec 43(6) determines the amount and the timing of these payments.

Upon advice of the change, the Shire of Cranbrook's Shire President, Cr Perin Mulcahy, said:

"This means that Forest Products Commission no longer contributes to the community in which it operates, and the extra load must be spread amongst the other ratepayers. As FPC's plans to purchase more land under the State Government's \$350 million funding commitment to planting pine, the effect of their decision will increase proportionally to the amount of land purchased, and whilst it has ceased to pay rates, it continues to be a user of our roads."

On Friday 20 March 2026, in response to the January meeting, a letter was received from the Minister, the Hon Jackie Jarvis, MLC, to advise that FPC would contribute to the communities in which it had purchased land through a sponsorship funding agreement for two years. The sum payable was approximately the rates due for 2025/26 FY and 2026/27 FY. (\$60,000). We were advised that beyond this term the FPC would be "seeking feedback from the Shires on opportunities for FPC to contribute to specific services that will support the plantation industry."

This was not the solution we had hoped to receive, but at least it was a positive response to our request to address the gap left by FPC's non-payment of rates, and we thank the Minister for the letter. It is presumed that the "contribute to specific services that will support the plantation industry" may be reflected in FPC paying funds towards our roads that their trucks use or some similar service provided by the Shire, this is yet to be decided.

Wouldn't it be easier just to pay rates?

"Team Quickie" secured third place, with a total of 30 foxes and 2 rabbits.

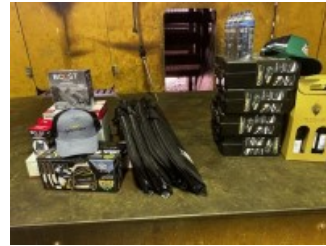
The overall tally for the event was as follows:

Pretty but problematic – Spring bulbs

Choosing spring colour wisely

Autumn is the time to choose and plant our spring bulbs, and gardeners have never had more choice! Local nurseries, garden centres, weekend markets, online retailers, and those irresistible full-colour catalogues. But before you fill your trolley, there are a few things worth knowing. Some popular bulbs are surprisingly toxic to people and animals; others have escaped gardens entirely and are now serious environmental weeds. When it comes to bulbs a little knowledge goes a long way.

Invasive bulbs

Around two-thirds of weeds in Australia were deliberately introduced as garden plants or fodder crops. The south-west of WA has a Mediterranean-type climate, which means plants from South Africa and other Mediterranean regions grow exceptionally well here, sometimes too well!

Several common bulbs can escape from gardens and invade bushland, outcompeting native plants. Plants to be cautious about include Freesia, Watsonia, Sparaxis and some Gladiolus, particularly older varieties.

Toxic bulbs

Cape tulips (*Moraea* spp.) were introduced in the 1800s; they are now widespread, established weeds. It's their toxic glycosides that are responsible for livestock poisoning.

Chincerinchee (*Ornithogalum thyrsoides*) is toxic to livestock and dogs; it's known to cause gastrointestinal illness and blindness in cattle. Found at a few locations in the south-west of WA, it's one to avoid.

Arum lily (*Zantedeschia aethiopica*) is beautiful but extremely invasive, and toxic to all livestock, pets and humans. It has colonised thousands of hectares in south-west WA.

Tips for safe plantings

Choose non-invasive, non-toxic species where possible.

Store bulbs safely, away from children and pets, and label anything in the fridge.

Never dump garden waste in bushland or farmland – a single discarded bulb can establish a new weed population.

Self check: is your association at risk of being cancelled?

Almost 5,000 incorporated associations in Western Australia are currently behind in lodging one or more annual information statements (AIS) and are at risk of being de-registered.

Consumer Protection administers incorporated associations, not-for-profit groups set up for many social, sporting or community purposes – for example, a swimming club, a school P&C, a charity or a volunteer group.

There’s lots of reasons people want to form an association but to remain active, an AIS must be submitted every year at the end of their financial year.

A total of 4,901 associations in WA are currently behind in lodging their AIS. Consumer Protection has attempted to contact them via email and notifications. When an association does not submit its AIS, Consumer Protection may believe it is no longer operating and take action to cancel its incorporation.

Consumer Protection has published a list of associations that are overdue in lodging their AIS. You can check if your association is listed by visiting - <https://www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au/associations-information-statement>

Even if your association is not on the list, this is a sharp reminder of the importance of complying with the obligations more broadly and keeping your association’s contact details current. It can be a good idea to use a general email address that multiple management committee members can access rather than a specific person's to ensure emails from Consumer Protection are received if someone is away or leaves the association.

Information statements must be submitted within six months after the end of an association’s financial year. Associations and clubs can choose their own financial year, so the due date for submitting will differ between groups.

The quickest way to complete the AIS and submit forms on behalf of an incorporated association is via AssociationsOnline. If you are responsible for an incorporated association you can register for access to AssociationsOnline to manage its registration and other obligations at – www.lgirs.wa.gov.au/associationsonline.

Failure to act immediately may result in Consumer Protection taking further action by issuing a Show Cause Notice under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 to commence cancellation should the AIS not be lodged immediately.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

GREEN FLAGS

BBQs
Using gas (enclosed flame) or electric BBQs (no flame) with a five metre clearing around the BBQ.

LAWN MOWERS
Electric and battery-operated lawn mowers can be used, but only if they don't create a spark. Avoid using them on dry grass.

POWER TOOLS
The use of power tools is allowed as long as it doesn't create a spark.

HARVESTING ACTIVITIES
Harvesting activities are allowed, if the local government has not implemented a Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban.

RED FLAGS

BBQs
BBQs, cookers or smokers that use solid or liquid fuel are not permitted in areas that are not fully enclosed.

LAWN MOWERS
Mowing with equipment powered by an internal combustion engine.

HOT WORKS
Hot works outdoors are not permitted (including angle grinding, welding, soldering and gas cutting).

CAMPFIRES
Campfires, bonfires and all open-air fires are illegal.

OFF-ROAD DRIVING
Petrol or diesel vehicles like 4WDs, quad bikes and motorcycles can't be driven over areas containing vegetation.

*If you are a business or public authority, you can carry out certain activities without an exemption if you meet the specific conditions outlined in the regulations
