More than \$1 million for the Great Southern in REDs Round 8

Six Great Southern projects will share \$1.02 million in funding under Round 8 of the Regional Economic Development (RED) Grants program, supporting economic diversification and long-term business resilience.

The RED Grants program is investing \$60.85 million over eleven years in locally driven projects that stimulate economic growth and development in regional Western Australia.

The Hon Stephen Dawson MLC, Minister for Regional Development was in Albany on Friday 10 March to announce the successful Great Southern recipients in Round 8 of the RED Grants program.

J&S Castlehow Electrical Services will purchase and install a new industrial switchboard laser cutter with the help of a \$200,000 RED Grant. This will enable the business to expand into certified, advanced switchboard manufacturing, delivering advanced manufacturing in the Great Southern while creating new jobs and training opportunities.

A new heavy plant workshop and training facility will be constructed in Mount Barker, with Fulcher Contractors awarded \$200,000 for the project. The new workshop will increase the company's capacity to deliver civil contracting works while creating new opportunities for skilled workers, apprentices and trainees.

\$160,000 has been awarded to Aboriginal owned company Nowanup Noongar Boodjar for the construction of a multipurpose workshop in Nowanup, addressing critical infrastructure constraints and supporting the growth of Aboriginal led cultural immersion tourism and on country environmental services.

Frankland Rural has been awarded \$180,000 for the construction of a purpose-built agribusiness hub in the Frankland River town centre. The new hub will increase the capacity for local agronomy, soil testing and advisory services in the middle and upper Great Southern, boosting local expenditure and service availability.

The Denmark Hotel will upgrade their unused upstairs accommodation area, increasing the options and availability of premium budget accommodation for short-term workers and travellers with a \$175,000 RED Grant.

Albany's waterfront precinct is getting a boost, with \$105,000 awarded to Yefsea for the fit-out of their new locally owned seafood restaurant and takeaway. Once complete, Yefsea will create new jobs and strengthen the demand for locally caught seafood.

Great Southern Development Commission CEO Natasha Monks said, "Round 8 of the RED Grants program is delivering significant funding across multiple economic sectors in the Great Southern, helping our local businesses grow.

"The successful recipients in Round 8 will diversify the region's manufacturing, heavy industry, agribusiness, hospitality and cultural tourism offerings while supporting long term job creation and training.

"We look forward to watching these projects grow, develop and meaningfully contribute to our Great Southern economy."

The RED Grants Program is delivered by the Great Southern Development Commission for the Great Southern, with support from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD).

Since the program was launched in 2018, more than \$5.4 million has been allocated to 52 locally-driven projects across the Great Southern.

Frankland Rural's Project

Frankland Rural is gearing up for total upgrade after securing a massive grant from the State Government's regional economic development fund.

The business, owned and operated by Chloe Casson and Tim Trezise, is part of the Combined Rural Traders network and, through an 11-person team, supplies rural products and services to the Frankland River, Kojonup and Kendenup area.

This includes broadacre agronomy, livestock and viticultural services.

Chloe Casson said Frankland Rural has expanded many times over the past 20 years, but has finally outgrown its space.

Over time, Frankland Rural has become a community hub, and the build plans reflect this.

"We're servicing a bigger location than just Frankland River, so we're trying to accommodate by increasing our product range, increasing our staff, and being able

to give the community a hub,".

Located in the town centre, the new construction will include a public-facing office, merchandise shed, a new lab for agronomists to conduct research and development work, meeting rooms and offices, and three goods sheds at the rear of the site.

Frankland Rural works closely with nearby grower groups, community cropping groups, community resource centres, making the site an agribusiness hub for years to come.

The Frankland Rural team hope these groups could make use of the facility for local research and development projects, furthering the agricultural sector in the area.

The new build also prepares the business for the future, particularly when it comes to workplace safety, with purpose built sheds to handle dangerous goods.

Chloe credited the success of the business to being community minded.

"That is our strength, I think that is why we have the following we have, because we have a great agronomy team with knowledge and experience,".

With all plans just waiting on approvals, Chloe and Tim are hoping to have a shovel in the ground over the next six months, finished by the end of 2027, to open in 2028.

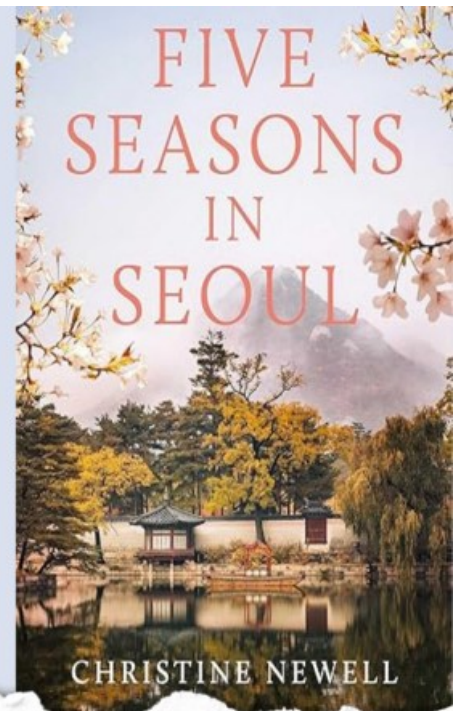

Backyard Buddies

Polly needs a permit!



Parrots and cockatoos make captivating pets, but their ownership comes with serious responsibilities.

Colourful, cheeky and engaging, it's easy to see why bird lovers are drawn to keeping parrots and cockatoos as pets. Many Western Australians are unaware, that a number of these birds are declared pests under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007* (BAM Act), meaning their uncontrolled presence in the wild can cause significant agricultural, economic, and environmental damage. For this reason, keeping exotic birds as pets is strictly regulated in WA. Owners must obtain the appropriate permits and meet mandatory enclosure requirements.

Obtaining a permit

From December 2025, the administration of restricted keeping permits for regulated birds transferred from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). All permit applications are now handled by DPIRD's Invasive Species and Environment Biosecurity Permit and Compliance Team. Current permits are valid until their stated expiry date. When it is time to renew, or for new applications, the process has been updated:

- Permit duration has increased to 5 years.
- Application fee is \$76.67 (cost recovery basis).

- Inspections may be required for new or renewal applications at \$72.68 (cost recovery basis).

Be aware! Regulated birds imported or travelling with you into WA also need an import permit to enter. Visit the DPIRD website (dpiird.wa.gov.au) for more information, or Google: 'DPIRD Invasive species permits'. To contact the Permits team directly: RKApplications@dpiird.wa.gov.au or 08 9368 3393.

A serious matter

Despite mandatory double-door entry systems and secure enclosure requirements, escapes do happen. Deliberate releases, although illegal, occur too. Even a small number of escaped birds can mark the beginning of a much larger problem. Parrots and cockatoos are intelligent, adaptable, and capable of establishing feral populations surprisingly quickly, as the unfortunate history of the rainbow lorikeet in Perth has demonstrated.

If you see an escaped pet bird or birds that look out of place, record the location, time, and a description of the bird (or take a photo if possible) and report it to the MyPestGuide team OR, PaDIS. See footer for details.

What WA renters need to know when disaster hits home

West Aussies are no strangers to disasters such as cyclones, bushfires and floods. But if you're renting, there might be the extra stress of working with your landlord should your home be affected by a catastrophe.

The good news is when it comes to rentals, both landlords and tenants have rights and responsibilities should a property become damaged or destroyed in a disaster such as a cyclone or bushfire.

Following damage to a rental home, the landlord is legally responsible for necessary repairs and maintenance to bring the property back to a liveable condition. If a tenant continues to be able to live in the rental, urgent repairs required to essential services such as power, gas, water including supply of hot water, and sewage should be arranged within 24 hours. If any other issues could cause someone harm or undue hardship, or cause further damage then works need to be arranged within 48 hours.

With urgent repairs, if you cannot reach your landlord or if within 24 hours, the landlord fails to act, then you can employ a suitably qualified repairer to fix the issue to the minimum standard. Please be aware that there may be delays as it can be difficult to get tradespeople to your home as many properties may need repair after a disaster.

When services to an entire area have been impaired – such as when power poles burn down or the water supply becomes compromised – it can take the authorities some time to resolve the issues, but the landlord could consider providing a generator, potable water or if not, then a rent reduction for the duration. In these cases, Consumer Protection can assist the parties to reach a mutual agreement.

If your house has been destroyed or deemed by the Local Government to be unfit to live in, you can approach the landlord to end the lease immediately. The landlord should finalise the tenancy and repay the bond in the normal way and they can't take money out of the bond to cover damage caused by a disaster.

When it comes to debris, emergency services may already have a cleaning program in place, so contact the local authorities, such as the local council or emergency services for advice.

It's also smart to be wary of travelling conmen or unlicensed traders who can target areas after a disaster going door-to-door, offering cheap cash-only deals.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

GREEN FLAGS

BBQs
Using gas (enclosed flame) or electric BBQs (no flame) with a five metre clearing around the BBQ.

LAWN MOWERS
Electric and battery-operated lawn mowers can be used, but only if they don't create a spark. Avoid using them on dry grass.

POWER TOOLS
The use of power tools is allowed as long as it doesn't create a spark.

HARVESTING ACTIVITIES
Harvesting activities are allowed, if the local government has not implemented a Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban.

RED FLAGS

BBQs
BBQs, cookers or smokers that use solid or liquid fuel are not permitted in areas that are not fully enclosed.

LAWN MOWERS
Mowing with equipment powered by an internal combustion engine.

HOT WORKS
Hot works outdoors are not permitted (including angle grinding, welding, soldering and gas cutting).

CAMPFIRES
Campfires, bonfires and all open-air fires are illegal.

OFF-ROAD DRIVING
Petrol or diesel vehicles like 4WDs, quad bikes and motorcycles can't be driven over areas containing vegetation.

*If you are a business or public authority, you can carry out certain activities without an exemption if you meet the specific conditions outlined in the regulations
