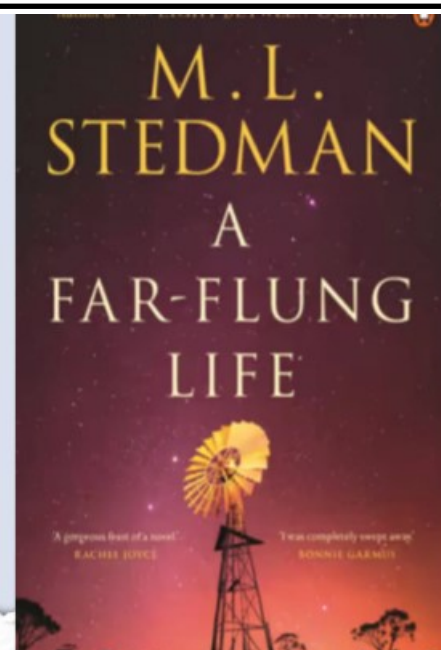

CRC Book Club August read - *A Far-Flung Life*

From the Principals Desk

It has been a wonderful start to the semester, with students making the most of the fine weather and enjoying a range of activities in the playground. Skipping has been a particular highlight, especially during 'Run Club', with many students building stamina, developing skills and displaying enthusiasm. Even some of the 'old' skipping rhymes have been shared as part of long rope skipping. Our loose parts play area continues to be a popular space, encouraging creativity, collaboration and problem-solving during break times.

Students have also been enjoying the fresh produce from our school garden, with opportunities to harvest and taste a variety of seasonal fruits and vegetables. These experiences help students develop an appreciation for healthy eating and the effort involved in growing food.

In classrooms, we have quickly settled back into learning and are continuing to build on the strong foundations established during Semester One. We are proud of the way students are responding to teacher feedback, using it to improve their learning and strive for personal bests.

NAIDOC Week Celebrations & Lake Poorrarecup Excursion

During Week 2 and 3 of this term we celebrated NAIDOC week through a variety of activities. This culminated with our visit to Lake Poorrarecup where we worked with Larry Blight, a Menang Elder, who shared his knowledge about how wetlands were used, bush tucker and tools/artefacts which might have been used.

Over the last 3 years we have taken special pride in establishing a connection with Larry, allowing the students to build their knowledge and benefit from his wisdom.

Importantly these perspectives are not confined to a single week but have been thoughtfully and authentically embedded in our teaching and learning over recent years. This ongoing commitment enriches students' understanding, strengthens cultural appreciation and respect, and supports our shared journey towards reconciliation.

Our visit to Lake Poorrarecup involved learning about the wetland area, a bushwalk to the Evans gravesite and learning about the ration track, reading the interpretive signage and looking at endemic flora and evidence of fauna, looking for invertebrates in lake

water samples and sketching different vegetation. We had a fabulous time exploring our local area!

e-Safety and Digital Wellbeing Workshops

Huge thanks to our families, community members, staff and students who supported our e-Safety and Digital Wellbeing workshops last Friday, presented by Kaylene Kerr. Students participated in some great sessions learning about how to manage their own digital wellbeing, the impacts to too much technology on growing brains and bodies, how to manage tricky situations and people that they might encounter through gaming and social media.

The information session for parents and community members was well attended and participants learned about:

- The impact of screen time on child development
- Managing time blindness, tech tantrums and healthy boundaries
- Supporting social, emotional and relational development
- Persuasive technology, social media and media literacy
- Age inappropriate, hurtful, harmful and illegal content
- Recognising and responding to tricky people and unsafe behaviours
- Online grooming
- Creating a family technology plan
- Parental controls

A special thank you to our P&C for catering afternoon tea and for their generous financial support of these sessions. Their commitment to our school community makes opportunities like this possible, allowing us to bring high-quality presenters and learning experiences to our local area.

While parents and community members attended the workshop, students enjoyed a daytime disco on the tiger turf. Huge thanks to Mrs Archdeacon and Ms A who helped supervise the afternoon's fun and activities.

Our newly developed e-Safety and Digital Wellbeing Policy, which Kaylene Kerr cast her expert eye over, has been approved by our School Board and can now be found on our school website.

The policy, student workshops and parent information session were developed in response to feedback gathered from families through a 2025 survey. The survey identified opportunities to strengthen e-Safety and digital awareness across the school community, as well as develop more effective ways to support students

when online issues arise.

The Great Southern region to go yellow for life-changing cancer research this Daffodil Day

Cancer Council WA is calling on residents and businesses in the Great Southern region to get involved in Daffodil Day's 40 year anniversary this August, in a bid to raise more than \$5.5 million nationally for life-changing cancer research.

Cancer Council WA Great Southern Regional Cancer Prevention Coordinator, Lavinya Vasudevan, said Daffodil Day is a day to give hope for all of us affected by cancer. “Daffodil Day is about rallying together and supporting people who have faced cancer head-on and honouring the ones we lost too soon. It's about celebrating vital life-changing cancer research and raising crucial funds to keep improving cancer outcomes,” Ms Vasudevan name said.

“There are so many ways to be involved. You can take part in the Daffodil Day Dip by plunging into cold water to raise funds, host a yellow-themed fundraiser at your workplace, school or sporting club, buy fresh daffodils or merchandise from one of Cancer Council WA's stalls, or simply make a donation online to support life-changing cancer research.

“You can also show your support on social media by wearing yellow, sharing your fundraising efforts and encouraging others to get involved using #DaffodilDay. However you choose to participate, you'll be helping bring us closer to a future free from cancer.” Ms Vasudevan said Daffodil Day is a powerful reminder of the impact the community can have when they come together.

“Almost 15,000 West Australians are diagnosed with cancer every year,” Lavinya said. “This means every day another 40 West Aussies will hear the words “you have cancer”.

“Despite advances made in research and improving survival rates for many cancers, we know that almost one in two Australians will be diagnosed by the age of 85.

“Thanks to investment in research over many years, amazing advancements have been made in cancer prevention, screening and treatment, helping to increase survival rates from around 50 per cent in the 1980s to more than 70 per cent today.

“Cancer doesn't rest, and neither do our researchers. By going yellow this August, you're helping us take the next step in improving cancer prevention, treatment and survival.”

Daffodil Day officially falls on Thursday 20 August, but the entire month is a chance to show your support.

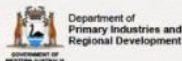

Cancer Council WA urges participation in life-saving National Bowel Cancer Screening Program



Don't put it off. Your free bowel cancer screening test could save your life. Cancer Council WA is urging more West Australians to take part in the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program, with only four in 10 eligible Australians currently completing the free test.

Bowel cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in Australia, claiming more lives each year than breast, prostate or skin cancer. Yet, it's also one of the most treatable if detected early, with over 90 per cent of cases successfully treated when caught in the initial stages.

The screening kit is free, quick, and easy to use in the privacy of your own home. But too often, it's tucked away and forgotten, delaying action that could make all the difference – let's change that!

Automatic tipping – is it allowed?

Have you noticed some restaurants and bars adding an automatic tip or a pre-selected gratuity appearing to your bill?

While tipping is common in some countries, Australia has traditionally operated on a wage-based system where tipping is voluntary but recently, we've been seeing in a dark pattern of automatic tipping which can sometimes also be disguised in 'hidden fees' or 'drip pricing'.

Businesses can ask for a tip, and in some circumstances, they may add a service charge, but they must be transparent about it and not mislead you as the consumer, about the true price you will pay.

Under Australian Consumer Law, businesses must clearly communicate the total price, including any unavoidable or pre-selected fees, before you commit to an order.

Automatic tipping commonly happens in hospitality when people pay in-person through eftpos, use QR code ordering or ride-sharing or food delivery apps.

Sometimes an online ordering platform can offer a pre-selected tip, provided you can clearly see and adjust or remove it before completing the transaction, but when you're dining in, this may not always be clear.

That's why it's important to always ask for an itemised bill so you can check the total amount and see if a compulsory tip or "gratuity" has been included.

Many people may not be aware that if a tip/gratuity/or service fee has been automatically added to your bill without the venue disclosing it to you upfront, the fee can be removed on request.

Another way a business can add on costs is when extra charges are hidden or only revealed at the final stage of a transaction. This is known as "drip pricing", where consumers are attracted by one price only to discover additional mandatory charges later in the purchase process.

Businesses must be upfront and clearly disclose to consumers at the start of a purchasing process the types of fees that will apply and when.

A "tip" or "gratuity" is different from a surcharge which is commonly added during public holidays or weekends and is allowed - provided they are properly disclosed.

Consumers must be able to see this information before ordering, for example a note on the menu.

The bottom line for service charges or automatic gratuities is transparency.

When dining-out or ordering food through a QR code or online platform, take your time to review the itemised bill or checkout screen and remember:

- ♦ Any mandatory service charges must be clearly communicated well in advance
- ♦ Optional service charges must never be automatically added to a bill
- ♦ If you're unsure, ask staff to explain any additional charges you do not understand.

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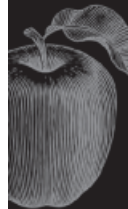

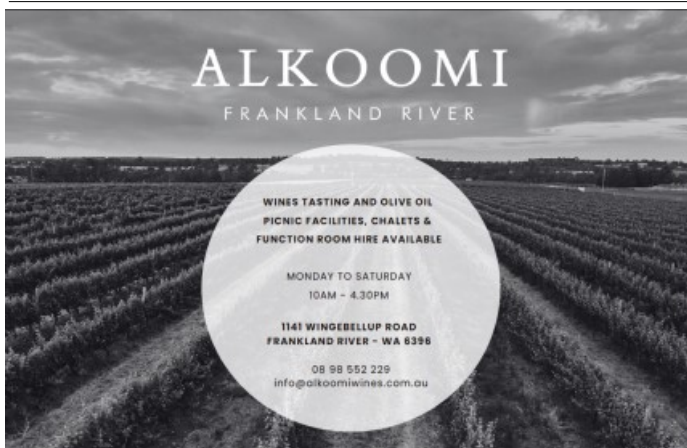
